A Case Study

Ephesians 6:1-4

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land."

Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

How does this piece fit?

The Lord unites us all as one in his body, no matter how different we are or what roles we fill, and our unity is extremely important to him.

4th level of context

Nugget passage in light of the next level of context:

all of Ephesians and all of redemptive history

All of Ephesians and all of redemptive history

God redeemed us in order to display the glorious riches of his grace, at work in us and in our relationships.
