- Shame and Guilt--What are the differences?

- At the start, shame and guilt are essentially the same.

- As shame matures, shame comprises both guilt and rejection. It can stick to you because of what you did, what was done to you, or both.

- Now, let's find it in ourselves. The basic triad of shame is nakedness, cast out and unclean.

- Next, let's hear what God says. As you go through Scripture, keep an eye out for
 - the naked receiving investiture and clothed in honor and glory (Ex 28)
